ONCE ENTRY IS CONFIRMED, EACH EXHIBITOR WILL BE GIVEN A NECK TAG WHICH MUST BE WORN AT ALL TIMES WHILE THE EXHIBIT IS IN THE JUDGING RING.

There are no admission fees or entry fees to be paid by any competitor or spectator.

Only one animal per handler is permitted.

Competitors must care for and feed and attend to the animals themselves from one week of birth onward. All animals must be born between 1st June – 30th September 2018.

For best results in the wool classes lambs should be shorn by 1st January 2019.

1st to 5th place will be awarded prize money and Royal Easter Show ribbons.

Points Prize

Points will be allocated and totaled for prize winners collectively in the pet lambs and goats classes born from 1st June – 30th September 2018.

1. The exhibitors from the same school gaining the most prize winning points will receive a **Chrome Reader or a similar product/voucher** for their school.

2. To encourage school children to attend with their pet lamb or pet goat, the school with the most entries will receive a **Chrome Reader or a similar product/voucher**. This will be subject to a written confirmation from their school that each handler from their respective school has exhibited at a school calf club, agricultural day, or group day 2018/2019 season.

Points will be allocated as follows.

The prize will be awarded directly to the winning school. When selecting the Champion, only the 1st placegetters will be shown. For Reserve Champion the remaining 1st placegetters along with the 2nd placegetters from the class from which the Champion has been named will be shown.

When selecting the Supreme Champion only the animals that have received a Champion ribbon are eligible to enter.

In the event of a tie, the countback system will apply. In the event of there still being a tie an independent Judge shall be called upon to determine between those entries for that place.

The Judge's decision will be final.

Children to have reared the animal in the year 1st June to 30th September 2018 and exhibited at their local school or group day calf club in the 2018/2019 season.

- All lambs must be docked. Ram lambs are permitted.
- Lambs may be brushed, but not be washed.
- Lambs to be led on the right hand side to the handler in a clockwise circle of approximately six metres.
- The use of halters is not permitted. Lambs are to be secured by a collar and the lead easily detachable.
- High Jump
A 12 gallon drum lying on its side supports a plank three metres long and 30 cm wide, rough sawn. The bottom end of the plank is to be 10cm off the ground. Handler to lead the lamb, the lamb is to walk up the plank, pause, and then jump off the end, with the entrant walking alongside the plank. The lamb and handler competing are to be the only ones in the ring with the Judge and Steward.
- Call
The lamb is held by the Steward. The handler is to call the lamb from approximately 10 metres away. The lamb and child competing are to be the only ones in the ring with the Judge and Steward.
- Lambs may be entered from the following classes of meat or wool breeds. Judges may advise.
- THREE BEST LAMBS from one school. The group may be made up of Junior, Intermediate & Senior School competitors combined. The lambs should be grouped together in meat or wool breeds. Ribbons will be awarded to each group member. Lambs can only be entered into one group class ie not both meat and wool. Schools may enter 1 group per class.
- Fancy Dress Individual and their pet.
There is no Champion section.

Champion Ribbons will be awarded to each class.

Junior Age 5-7 years of age
Intermediate Age 8-10 years of age
Senior Age 11-13 years of age

Children to have reared the animal in the year 1st June to 30th September 2018 and exhibited at their local school or group day calf club in the 2018/2019 season.

1. There will be individual classes for Dairy, Meat and Fibre.
2. Goats may be groomed in any manner.
3. Goats to be led on the right hand side to the handler in a clockwise circle of approximately six metres.
4. The use of halters is not permitted. Goats are to be secured by a collar and the lead easily detachable.
5. High Jump
A 12 gallon drum lying on its side supports a plank three metres long and 30 cm wide, rough sawn. The bottom end of the plank is to be 10cm off the ground. Handler to lead the goat, the goat is to walk up the plank, pause, and then jump off the end, with the entrant walking alongside the plank. The goat and handler competing are to be the only ones in the ring with the Judge and Steward.
6. Call
The goat is held by the Steward. The handler is to call the goat from approximately 10 metres away. The goat and child competing are to be the only ones in the ring with the Judge and Steward.
7. THREE BEST GOATS from one school. The group may be made up of Junior, Intermediate & Senior School competitors combined. The goats should be grouped together by appearance and leading ability. Ribbons will be awarded to each group member. Schools may entre 1 group per class.

Meat (e.g. Boer)
